I want to express my profound gratitude to the Governor of Edo state for establishing the State Youth Parliament, and the Ministry of Youth for their pivotal roles in ensuring the parliament's functionality. My heartfelt thanks go out to all who have supported us along the way.

Reflecting on my tenure as Speaker of the Edo State Youth Parliament, it's crucial to acknowledge that our journey wasn't as rosy as we paint it to be today. Despite our achievements, we faced significant challenges, particularly in the form of insufficient support from the state government.

However, through the determination of myself and my fellow honorable members, we persevered and propelled the parliament forward.

Despite the lack of necessary support, we remained steadfast in our commitment to empower ourselves and uplift our constituents. Our successes were hard-earned, achieved through sheer grit and dedication in the face of adversity.

This platform has afforded me the opportunity to learn, network, and explore numerous countries around the world, from South Africa to Kenya, Ethiopia, UAE, Germany, Spain, France, Morocco, and beyond.





My farewell speech reflects on our journey thus far, which began in 2021 after our swearing-in. Our mission was to empower ourselves before striving to improve the lives of our constituents.

As the saying goes, "you can't give what you don't have." During this time, we successfully advocated for training in digital literacy and the Internet of Things, benefiting both parliament members and constituents. After completing the training, participants received certifications and tools such as laptops and drones to aid in their continued learning.

In addressing the challenges our nation faces, I hosted the National Youth Dialogue in 2021, attracting national stakeholders to discuss the theme: "Restructuring: The Effect of Insecurity, Wastage, and Corruption on the Development of Nigeria." Notable speakers included Hon. Najib Waziri Tambuwal, the son of the then Sokoto State Governor, and Rt. Hon. Marcus Onobun, the former Speaker of the Edo State House of Assembly.

In October of last year, I was honoured to be elected as the chairman of the conference of state youth parliament speakers of Nigeria, further solidifying our impact on a national level.

Our journey's success has been made possible through crowdfunding, as we received limited support from the ministry due to financial constraints. This enabled us to sponsor two parliamentarians to attend the Africa Asia Youth Forum in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

Following this event, we engaged with the Nigerian Ambassador to Rwanda, Ambassador Aishatu Aliyu Musa, in Kigali, Rwanda, to discuss human capital development and exchange.

Upon returning to Nigeria, we organized a ground breaking joint plenary session between the Edo State Youth Parliament and Delta State Youth Parliament, focusing on pressing issues such as security and youth development.

Last May, we toured Edo State and discovered a dilapidated school in the Odighi community. Witnessing the plight of the children spurred us into action, leading to the complete renovation of Amayo Primary School, which we then handed over to the Edo state government.

In October of last year, I was honored to be elected as the chairman of the conference of state youth parliament speakers of Nigeria, further solidifying our impact on a national level.

In December, attending COP28 as a Nigerian delegate alongside President Bola Ahmed Tinubu allowed me to secure accreditation for four of my colleagues. Interacting with President Tinubu in Dubai provided valuable networking opportunities and expanded my knowledge base.

Just a few days ago, on April 11th, 2024, I hosted a webinar session themed 'Catalyzing Climate Action: Youth-Led Initiative



Empowering Emerging Leaders.’ Esteemed speakers from various parts of the world, including the Minister of State for Youth, Hon. Ayodele Wisdom, participated in this event.

I want to emphasize that the parliament is not a profit-making venture. My tenure as Speaker aimed to empower and energize the youth, utilizing the office granted to me by divine providence.

As we bid farewell to this esteemed platform, let us carry forth the spirit of unity, determination, and service. Let us continue to raise our voices for the betterment of society, striving for a more inclusive and equitable world. As we conclude this chapter, let our actions write the next, forging a legacy that inspires hope, courage, and progress in the hearts of those who dare to dream.

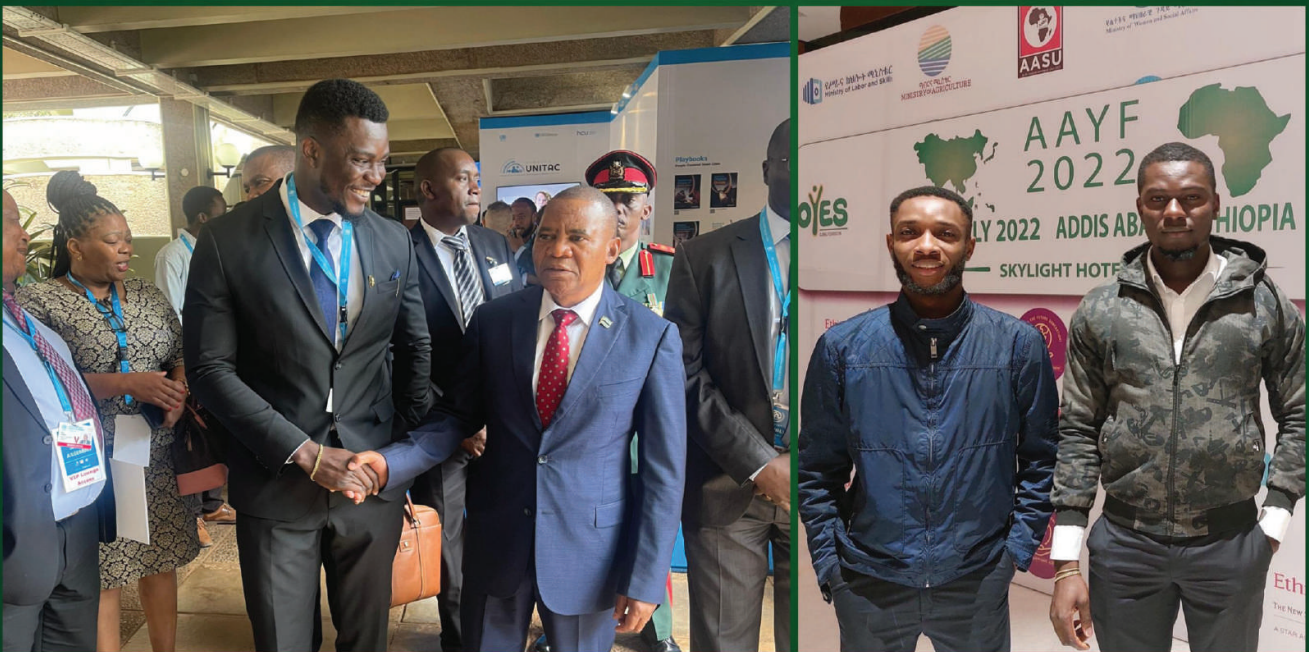

The Parliament.

The Edo State Youth Parliament is a Legislative and Developmental Training Institution created by the Ministry of Youth and Humanitarian Affairs to strengthen, reinforce, and consolidate efforts in empowering young people through meaningful youth representation in driving the state's developmental agenda.

The Edo State Youth Parliament operates under the guidance of the Edo State House of Assembly and is funded by the Ministry of Youth and Humanitarian Affairs.

The structure of the Edo State Youth Parliament is a non-partisan youth body modeled after the Edo State House of Assembly, thus ensuring a robust presence across the 24 constituencies within the 18 Local Government Areas of the state.

The Parliament provides a platform for young individuals to express their perspectives on issues that affect their respective constituencies and the state at large.

Functions.

Projects & Achievements ; Memories of Successful Projects and Events.

International Youth Day – August 12, 2021.

To commemorate International Youth Day, we organized a webinar chaired by Rt. Hon. Marous Onobun, Speaker of the Edo State House of Assembly. The webinar's theme was Transforming Food Systems; Youth Innovation for Human and Planetary Health; and the guest speakers were Kenneth Obayuwana, the Executive Director for Positive Impact Africa, and Ms. Osayuwamen Aladeselu, the Focal Person for Edo State Social Investment Program.

National Youth Dialogue – September 28, 2021.

I had the distinct honor of organizing and hosting the second edition of the National Youth Dialogue. This program was built on the legacy established by Honorable Daniel Uwadia, who hosted the first edition. The Nigerian Youth Dialogue brought together a diverse group of national stakeholders united by a common goal: engaging in a comprehensive discussion on the theme of "Restructuring: The Impact of Insecurity, Wastage, and Corruption on the Development of Nigeria."

During this enlightening event, we had the privilege of hearing from distinguished speakers who shared their valuable insights. Notable among them was Hon. Najib Aminu Wazir Tambuwal, whose perspectives enriched our understanding of the theme. Additionally, we were honored to have the presence of Rt. Hon. Marcus Onobun, the Speaker of the Edo State House of Assembly, who shared his wealth of experience and knowledge.

Furthermore, it's worth mentioning that Hon. Daniel Uwadia, who hosted the first edition, laid the foundation upon which this successful program was built.

The National Youth Dialogue provided a vital platform for in-depth discussions, allowing us to explore the intricacies of the issues at hand and seek viable solutions. It served as a testament to the power of dialogue and collaboration in addressing critical challenges and fostering the development of our beloved Nigeria.



World Mental Health Day – October 10, 2021.

Due to the high number of suicide cases recorded in the state, it was imperative for us as a parliament to commemorate this day. We initiated social engagement online by creating a social media buzz with the hashtag “Speak Up” to raise more awareness about the pressing issues surrounding mental health and the best ways to manage stress.

To underscore the importance of this day, we organized a webinar with the theme “Mental Health in an Unequal World.” The session was hosted by Hon. Joshua Imodu, Chairman of the House Committee on Health, and featured Dr. Mrs. Helen Eboeime, a consultant psychiatrist, as the guest speaker. She emphasized the importance of seeking help from professional counselors, as they are trained to provide valuable support.



Edo Youth Digital Skills Empowerment Program – February 24, 2022.

Hon. Kelvin Prosper-Oguns, a member of the Edo State Youth Parliament representing Own West constituency, organized an intensive digital skills training program.

This collaboration involved “Goldtek International,” “Edojobs,” and “Edo Innovative.” The training aimed to equip youth with a comprehensive understanding of the digital arena and its opportunities, covering areas such as digital marketing strategies, brand positioning, and monetization of acquired digital marketing skills.

The program was a resounding success, with over 100 participants actively engaged. Laptops and relevant learning tools were generously provided, ensuring the smooth running of the program. Upon conclusion, certificates of participation, prizes, and souvenirs were distributed to deserving participants.





Edo State Youth Parliament Essay Writing Competition – June 18, 2022

The Edo State Youth Parliament organized a two-part essay writing competition, with the first round held on June 18, 2022. Spearheaded by Hon. Otamere Anthony, the member representing Egor constituency, the competition saw enthusiastic participation from over 700 youths aged 15 to 29 from diverse areas of Edo state.

The competition aimed to provide a platform for individuals to express themselves regardless of their field of study. The essay topic focused on leveraging Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in combating societal insecurity.

The two-part event concluded with an award ceremony held at the Ighodalo Imade Bello (SAN) conference centre, where the top five participants were presented with awards.



Basic Sound Production Training – May 10, 2022.

In collaboration with JUST EMG, my office organized a one-month basic sound production course for over 50 youths.

The training encompassed sound production, piano skills, and sight-reading, providing valuable benefits to all participants.

Intervention in Police Brutality – July 14, 2022.

The Speaker, Rt. Hon. Osawe Uwagboe, led parliamentarians on a courtesy visit to the Commissioner of Police, Mr. Philip Aliyu Ogbadu. The objective was to address security concerns stemming from a series of reports regarding police assaults on students and youth and to find the best way to rebuild trust between the youth community and the Police force.

During a press conference following our productive deliberation, the parliament appealed to the Edo state youth to remain law-abiding and continue advocating for peace within their communities.

Edo Youth Vocational Skills (POP & Tiles) Empowerment Program – January 17 – 29, 2023.

In collaboration with Edo Jobs and the supervision of Hon. Imhontu Olumense, the Edo State Youth Parliament organized a two-week empowerment program with a focus on Plaster of Paris (POP) and tile making.

The program aimed to equip the youth with valuable skills for gainful employment in the growing construction sector, ensuring equal opportunities for all participants, irrespective of their educational backgrounds.

Edo Youth Vocational Skills (Cosmetology) – Empowerment Program June 11, 2022.

Hon. Imhontu Olumense conducted a certified cosmetology training program for 50 youths. The intensive training was designed to mold their minds and prepare them for a potential future.

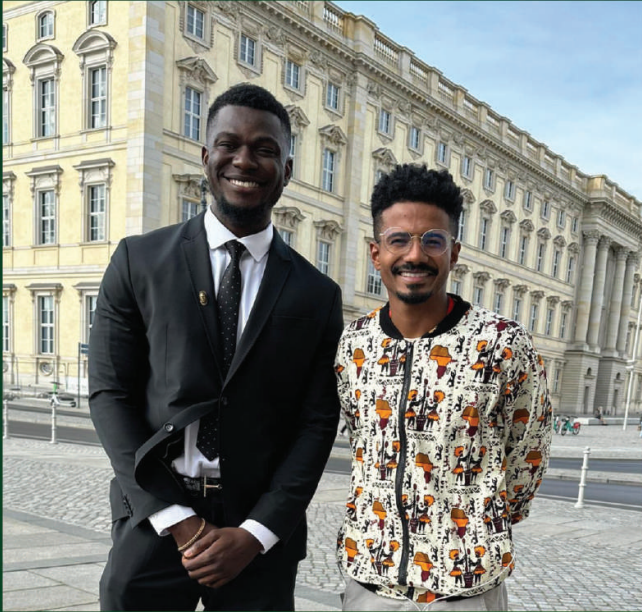

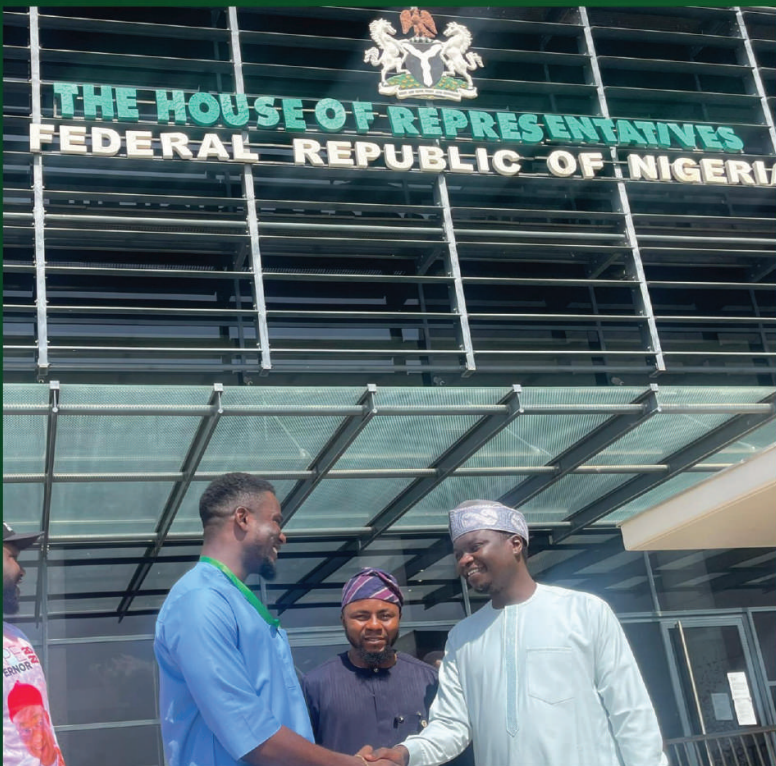

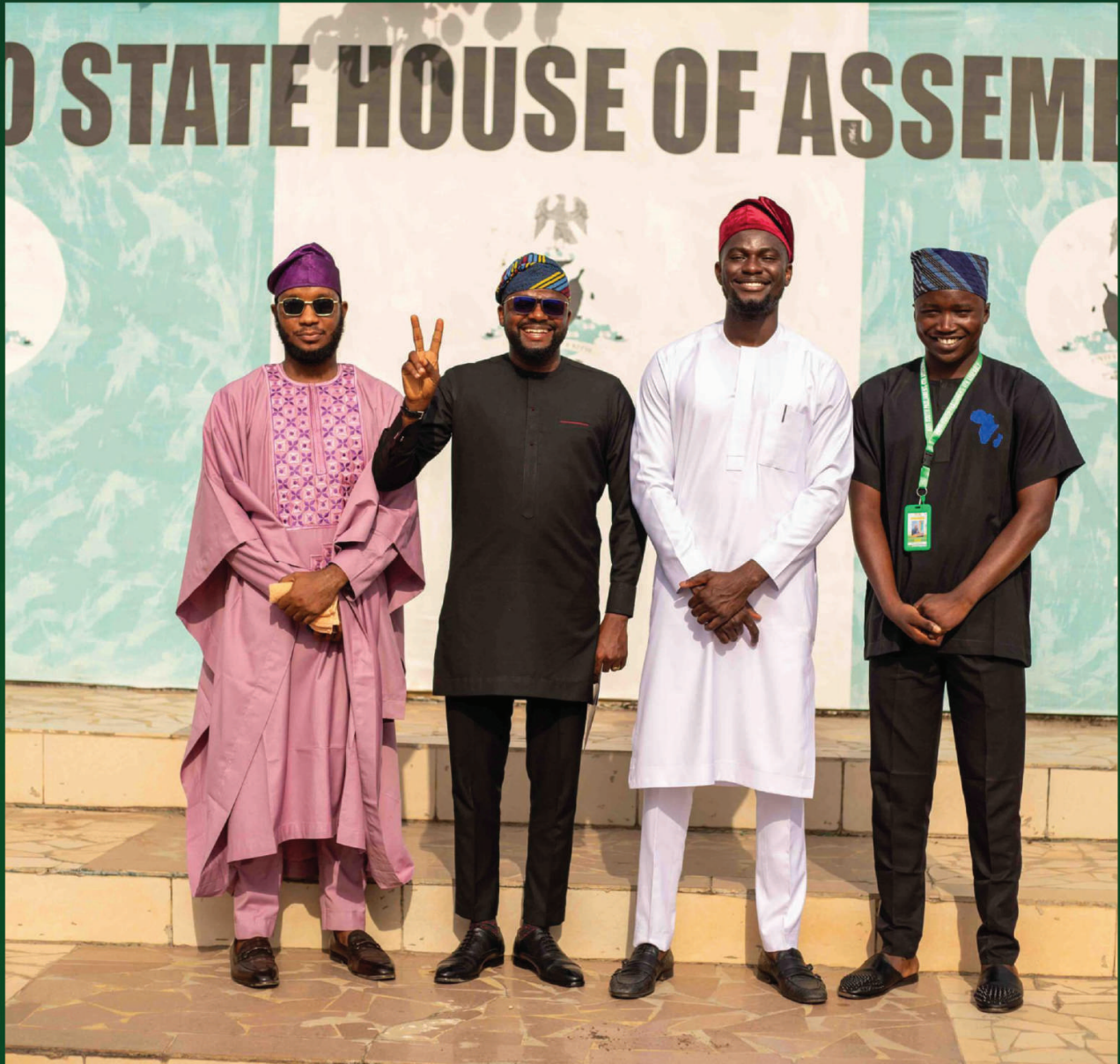
